Academic Standards at Clinton Community School District The Clinton Community School District has adopted the Common Core State Standards (CCSS) for Reading and Writing (Language Arts and Disciplinary Literacy) and Mathematics, and Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) in Science. The District also implements the Wisconsin Model Academic Standards in Geography and History (Social Studies) and all related areas including Music, Art, Physical Education, Health Education, Foreign Language, Family and Consumer Education, Agriculture Education, Business Education, and Technology Education. The Information and Technology Literacy Standards are being infused into all curricular areas. The District has also initiated a standardized Response to Intervention (RtI) Program. All students are universally screened in grades K-10, and the results of these exams are used to identify individual students who may need additional support or those who need to be accelerated. Each school incorporates RtI time in their schedules to meet the needs of all students. The District is also using STAR-Early Literacy, STAR 360, aimsWeb, Fountas and Pinnell benchmark screenings, and ongoing summative and formative assessments to guide individual instruction.
