Enrollment: Enrollment is determined on a first come-first served basis. **A class size of at least 12 will be required to hold a class.** Students enrolled in classes that do not meet the criteria will be asked to enroll in another class.

Transportation: Bus transportation will be available for students that are attending summer school who live outside the village but in the district. If interested in bus transportation, complete a transportation request form. Bus transportation will be scheduled after enrollment. Parents will be notified of the bus schedule prior to the start of summer school. If using bus transportation please complete your registration on or before the deadline to ensure transportation during the first week of summer school.

Cost: There are no fees for your child to participate in summer school unless specified by a teacher for a field trip or other expenses above and beyond classroom activities.

Food Service Program: During the upcoming summer school session Clinton Community School District will be offering a snack and lunch **at no charge** to all participating summer school students. Students may eat on site or take the lunch as a grab and go (if not riding the bus). This free program is brought to you by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction and the USDA.

Registration: ***All registration will be online again this year.*** Online registration will begin on **March 20** and go through **April 14th**. Paper registration forms will be accepted **after online registration** April 17- May 12. Please make sure to also fill out a transportation form if your student will need transportation.

*4K Registration will be on a different form due to slight differences in times and transportation. Registration will take place at screening.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Session 1: June 12- June 30

Both Periods 1&2 (8:30-11:45)

Grades 1-6: Outdoor Fun and Adventure- In this class, we teach students all about nature and ways we can enjoy nature. During the first week, students learn all about animal adaptations and how they use their adaptations to survive. We end our adaptation week with a trip to a local pond to look at an ecosystem and study the life cycle of frogs. Week 2 is survival week, where students learn about surviving in the wilderness by learning how to make shelters and build a fire. During week 3, students learn about different animals and fish in Wisconsin. This week continues with students learning about fishing, followed by a trip to Kiwanis Pond in Janesville to do some fishing. We end our final week with a trip to Carver's Rock Park where we go hiking, geocaching, and crayfish hunting. (Enrollment cap of 50 students)

Grades 7-12: Summer School Musical - This is for students entering grades 7 through 12. The students will be involved in all aspects of the production; from acting, singing, dancing to painting, building, costuming, publicity as well as concepts and principles of theater that are not currently instructed during the school year. The end product will be a musical presentation made available to the public. This year's musical will be James and the Giant Peach. The musical will run one week past the normal summer school session ending on July 7th. There will be **no** transportation provided for the musical students that week (7/5-7/7). (No enrollment cap)

Period 1 (8:30 – 10:00)

Grades K-2: Welcome to Camp Seussville- Welcome to Seussville, where we'll read our way into the wonderful world of Dr. Seuss. Wockets in Pockets and Truffula trees, this class will be a blast, and we think you'll agree! We'll meet Horton and Sneetches, Thing One and Thing Two! and of course the Cat in the Hat...Now all we need is You! We'll make art, puppets, and props as we get to know his crazy characters and classic rhymes - All while learning lessons about being a person, because a person's a person, no matter how small. (No enrollment cap)

Grades K-3: Nature Art- This course will involve using materials found in nature in order to make art. We will study patterns and colors found in nature and learn about the properties of different natural materials. We will spend time outside, gathering materials and getting inspiration from nature. Some activities will include nature suncatchers, leaf rubbings, mosaics, pine cone mobiles, and so much more! (Enrollment Cap of 15)

Grades K-3: Storybook Activity Time- This class is all about popular children's books! Each day we will be reading a few different books and making a craft or doing a fun activity that goes along with the book theme. Children will also get a chance to act out scenes from the books and even get to dress up like their favorite storybook characters. Some examples may include reading books about a tea party and then having an impromptu tea party in the classroom or reading books about creatures under the sea and then making some of those creatures. (Enrollment cap of 20)

Grades 1-4: Flowers, Fun, and More -This course provides a hands-on introduction to container gardening. Students in this course will plant flowers, learn how things grow, study wildlife within the garden and explore nature through field trips and nature walks. Learning connections will be made to art, music, science and literature as students celebrate stewardship for the environment and develop an appreciation of nature. (Enrollment cap of 20 students)

Grades 2-3: Summer Reading Club- This course will be designed to keep students' reading skills sharp by focusing on comprehension and vocabulary strategies. We'll be reading books, magazines, websites, and more with lessons that integrate specific strategies in reading! (No enrollment cap)

Grades 2-5: Lego Mania - Lego Mania is the perfect class for any Lego fan! In this class we will have daily Lego building challenges, create Lego projects, complete Lego experiments and read Lego books. This class will focus on science, math and engineering while still having fun!. (Enrollment Cap of 20)

Grades 2-6: Introduction to Spanish- This class is for students who are interested in learning Spanish. Students will learn how to have basic conversations and will learn lots of words and phrases in Spanish. Spanish will be taught in a fun and exciting way through music, food, games, projects, and crafts. Hope to see you there! ¡Espero verte allí! (No enrollment cap)

Grades 2-8: Keyboarding- Did you know we will all have our own computers next year?! In this class students will learn how to keyboard efficiently, while using proper keyboarding technique. Students will use keyboarding software that monitors their speed and accuracy. This class will be a very beneficial class for students in our 1:1 environment. (Enrollment Cap of 20)

Grades 3-5: The Art of Handwriting- Advertising, signs and messages are everywhere. Everyone doodles, makes bubble letters and some of you really want to figure out cursive writing! This class will help improve on handwriting, but will really focus on handwriting as an art. Students will create word art, improve handwriting skills, learn cursive and/or calligraphy. In taking this class, students will take home their own graphic design pieces using handwriting and typography. They will develop a deeper appreciation for the art of handwriting, typestyles, and signage. As well as learn a little history about it. In addition, they will improve on their personal handwriting skills. (No enrollment cap)

Grades 3-6: Let's Get Crafty- Do you love making crafts and beautiful creations? Then this is the summer school class for you! You will make all sorts of crafts from handmade tie dye T-shirts, picture frames, outdoor stepping stones, friendship bracelets and much more! You will be able to take home all your original creations to show off your new skills to your friends and family. (Enrollment cap of 14 students)

Grades 3-12: Crochet Corner - Calling all crafty crocheters! Students will have the opportunity to create hats, flowers, slippers, handbags, and more! The sky's the limit with Crochet Corner! Whether you're new to crochet or have already made some amazing items, this class is for you! (Enrollment cap of 12 students)

Grades 4-6: Mathletes – Students will be upping their math game in this class. Students will practice important math skills and then use those skills to play different games and activities. (No enrollment cap)

Grades 4-6: Chickens in the Classroom- Yup, you heard right, we will have baby chicks in our classroom! Students will get to witness the incubation, hatching, and growing of chickens. Throughout the course students will learn about different breeds of chickens. Students will calculate the feed and water consumption of the chickens as well as the hatch rates of different breeds. If you love baby chicks this is the class for you! (Enrollment cap of 20)

Grades 4-6: Volleyball- Calling all girls and boys that love learning new sports! Why not try volleyball. Come join us to learn the basics of volleyball including the forearm pass, overhead pass and serving as well as the rules according to WIAA standards. Team offense and defense will also be taught. Students will develop their skills on an individual, small group and team basis. (Enrollment cap of 45)

Grades 4-8: SPORTS - Students will be introduced to a number of Team and Lifetime Sports. The purpose is to expose the students to activities that will keep them active for their entire lives. The activities will include Rollerblading, Bowling, Racquet Sports (Badminton and Pickle Ball), Frisbee (Frisbee Golf), and a variety of team sports. (Enrollment cap of 30)

Grades 5-8: Exploring the Spanish World- The world's largest food fight? Burning of gigantic sculptures? Running away from Bulls? Welcome to Spain! This class is for students who are interested in learning about Spain's culture and the Spanish language. Students will learn all about Spain's culture through music, food, games, projects, and crafts. Can't wait to see you there! (Enrollment cap of 15)

Grades 7-8: Read and Write Graphic Novels- Interested in graphic novels or comic books? If so, then this class is for you! Come join us read graphic novels, and learn how to write your own graphic novels this summer! Enjoy learning the characteristics of a graphic novel and how to construct your own. (Enrollment cap of 15)

Grades 6-12: Introduction to Digital Photography- This course will cover the basics of digital photography. The first week, we will introduce composition and lighting. The next two weeks will be divided up to include close-up photography, portrait photography, and action photography or landscape photography. We will be taking and evaluating many photographs throughout this course, as well as researching and looking at the works of professional photographers. (Enrollment cap of 15)

Grades 7-12: Sweet Treats- An Introduction to Baking- Everyone loves sweets! Take this course to learn how to make some of your own favorites. Students will focus on the basics of baking; including following recipes, identifying and using the proper tools while baking, and identifying healthy alternatives. We will bake delicious favorites including cookies, cupcakes and brownies. Students will also explore various options to make these beloved classics healthier. (Enrollment cap of 20)

Grades 7-12: Athletic Performance- Athletic Performance is designed for athletes and students that are interested in gaining greater strength, size, explosive power, speed, agility, and flexibility. This is done through an hour and half class period where 40 minutes are spent in the weight room, 40 minutes in the gym or outside, plus a 5 minute warm-up and cool down. **This class only runs Monday-Thursday and will run until July 20th.** Students taking other summer school sessions will spend the Athletic Performance session in the LMC on Friday's. Students who do not have transportation do not have to continue attending after June 30th, unless they choose. There are four meeting times for this course, students can attend whichever one they choose daily. Two evening sessions are offered- 4:00-5:30 and 5:30-7:00. (No Enrollment Cap)

Grades 8-12: Design, Build, Create- If you like DIY crafts then THIS is the course for you! Students will create and design crafts with their own personal touch. They will learn how to use 3D modeling software and machines to build guided projects. Some of the concepts and machines that will be covered are; laser engraver, 3D printer, woodworking tools, electrical wiring, and material estimation. (Enrollment cap of 15)

Period 2 (10:15 – 11:45)

Grades K-2: Mad Fun Science- Fun hands on experiments will be conducted by our little scientists in the classroom lab. Art projects and cool concepts will be explored! Students will record their observations and predictions in their own science journals. Join us for some scientific adventures that are guaranteed to be explosively fun! (Enrollment cap of 16)

Grades K-3: Storybook Activity Time- This class is all about popular children's books! Each day we will be reading a few different books and making a craft or doing a fun activity that goes along with the book theme. Children will also get a chance to act out scenes from the books and even get to dress up like their favorite storybook characters. Some examples may include reading books about a tea party and then having an impromptu tea party in the classroom or reading books about creatures under the sea and then making some of those creatures. (Enrollment cap of 20)

Grades 1-2: The Art of Handwriting- Advertising, signs and messages are everywhere. Everyone doodles, makes bubble letters and some of you really want to figure out cursive writing! In addition, they will improve on their personal handwriting skills. (No enrollment cap)

Grades 2-3: Math-Magicians – Students, be prepared to look for patterns that seem to appear out of thin air! This class is focused on helping all students with their math abilities. (No Enrollment Cap)

Grades 2-3: Chickens in the Classroom- Yup, you heard right, we will have baby chicks in our classroom! Students will get to witness the incubation, hatching, and growing of chickens. Throughout the course students will learn about different breeds of chickens. Students will calculate

the feed and water consumption of the chickens as well as the hatch rates of different breeds. If you love baby chicks this is the class for you! (Enrollment cap of 20)

Grades 2-4: Puppets and Plays – Be creative! Students will learn to make puppets of various types and also have the opportunity to be an actor or actress as well. Through drama and puppetry we will explore reader's theatre, mini musicals, and the art of storytelling. (Enrollment cap of 15)

Grades 2-4: Youth Fitness - The objective of this class is to improve students overall fitness levels through many different activities including games, fitness stations, and climbing wall activities. (Enrollment cap of 24)

Grades 2-5: Girls Are Great – Join us girls as we discover cooking, STEM, dancing, social skills, and manners! This course will teach students how to cook without using the oven, dancing and cheerleading routines, proper social skills and manners, and STEM (science, technology, engineering, and mathematics). Everything that is great about being a girl is included in this class! (Enrollment cap of 20)

Grades 2-6: Introduction to Spanish II- Do you know some Spanish, but would really like to learn more? This class is for students who know or have some background knowledge in the Spanish language and are interested in learning more! Students will continue to build upon their Spanish skills in speaking, listening, reading, and writing by being actively engaged in the language. Students will learn lots of vocabulary and grammar. Spanish will be taught in a fun and exciting way through music, food, skits, games, projects, and crafts. Hope to see you there! ¡Espero verte allí! (Enrollment cap of 15)

Grades 2-8: Everything Google- Would you like to learn more about the Google Drive? Do you want to improve your computer skills so you can create impressive multimedia projects for school? Then this class is for you! You will learn about how the Google Drive works and how all of the applications that are in it can help you create documents for school. By the end of summer school you will be able to successfully use Google Docs, Spreadsheet, Presentation, search engine, and be able to use folders to organize your drive. This class will be extremely helpful for our 1:1 learning environment! (Enrollment cap of 20)

Grades 3-6: Let's Get Crafty- Do you love making crafts and beautiful creations? Then this is the summer school class for you! You will make all sorts of crafts from handmade tie dye T-shirts, picture frames, outdoor stepping stones, friendship bracelets and much more! (Enrollment cap of 15)

Session 2: July 31- August 18

Both Periods 1&2 (8:30-11:45)

Grade 5K: The ABC and 123 of Kindergarten! - Students will tame any fear of entering 5K through fun interactive readiness activities including math, reading, music, stories, and centers. (No Fee, No Enrollment Cap)

Grade 1: Going On A Bear Hunt! What Will We See in 1st Grade?- This course will give students the opportunity to familiarize themselves with the first grade in a fun yet educational way. Class lessons will integrate specific strategies that will promote reading readiness. Students will have opportunities to explore, examine and make mathematical connections as they investigate math concepts. Hands-on-activities will give students a chance to engage in problem solving through the application of concepts. Higher-order thinking skills will be used as students participate in activities and share their thoughts orally and in writing. (No Fee, No Enrollment Cap)

Grade 2: Dinosaur Dig Into 2nd Grade!- Students will prepare for the new school year learning all about dinosaurs! They will read about different species of dinosaurs, calculate the average size, and turn their classroom into a prehistoric forest! Help get your brain back on track and do it all while learning about these amazing creatures! (No enrollment cap)

This is done through an hour and half class period where 40 minutes are spent in the weight room, 40 minutes in the gym or outside, plus a 5 minute warm-up and cool down. **This class only runs Monday-Thursday and will run until July 20th.** Students taking other summer school sessions will spend the Athletic Performance session in the LMC on Friday's. Students who do not have transportation do not have to continue attending after June 30th, unless they choose. There are four meeting times for this course, students can attend whichever one they choose daily. Two evening sessions are offered- 4:00-5:30 and 5:30-7:00. (No Enrollment Cap)

Period 2 (10:15 – 11:45)

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Grades 6-10: The Magical World of Harry Potter- “You’re a wizard Harry!” And you can be a wizard too! Come experience the magical world of Harry Potter as we read sections from the books, learn to play quidditch and wizard’s chess, and create other magical objects like wands and butter beer.
