

CCSD Safety Upgrades

- A security gate was added to the entrance of the Clinton Elementary School playground. We did this to provide an extra layer of security to our students while they play outside throughout the day on their new playground.
- All new security cameras are being installed this summer. We will have all new security cameras installed throughout the district which will also include cameras being placed at our Football/Track Stadium, Bus Garage, Grounds Garage as well as our playground at CES.
- We also now have double secured vestibules at both CES & CJSHS.
- We were able to install an all call feature in our phone systems at both CES & CJSHS in the event of a (Code Red) anyone can pick up a phone and call for help if needed.
- We have a Safety Hub display that will be updated monthly with safety updates and reminders for staff and students alike.





Academics and Innovation

The 2022-2023 school year was a year of fresh starts. Clinton Elementary School was able to start in its newly renovated building and with collaborative furniture, optional interior/exterior learning spaces, and new resources that have made an impact on instruction and learning! Focusing on academic improvements, we were able to get new textbooks, equipment, and lab materials for a variety of departments at the Junior Senior High School. For the elementary school, we were able to purchase new English Language Arts and Social Studies curriculums as well as a school-wide math intervention program. Professional Development and Coaching were two other areas that staff participated heavily in over the course of the year. Having updated curricular and intervention materials in staff and students' hands and creating a system for lifelong learning opportunities help move learning forward for our students and our staff!



Inaugural Year for 4k-6 CES Building

The 2022-2023 school year was our inaugural year being a 4K-6th grade elementary school. Upgrades to CCSD's old middle school building, originally built in 1957, included significant improvements to different learning spaces. An outdoor garden comfortably fits two classrooms. Indoor learning spaces include hallway benches, and a spacious commons area in the new kindergarten addition to the building.





Connections

It's important to connect students with the greater Clinton community. Teachers are encouraged to invite members of the community in to speak about their careers whenever it will help make learning relevant in their classrooms. Field trips to local businesses, the fire department, and local farms take place throughout the year.







New Traditions

The new building brought new traditions. This year was our first Homecoming Mini-Parade where each of our 25 classrooms marched in. Now with grades spanning 4K through 6th grade, we are able to develop a greater sense of community with our students. We match up 4K classrooms with 3rd grade classrooms, 5K classrooms with 4th grade classrooms, 1st grade classrooms with 5th grade classrooms, and 2nd grade classrooms with 6th grade classrooms. These community classrooms meet multiple times a month to foster mentoring relationships for our students to feel more connected to the school community

An Academic Honors Program for the RVC is held at Edgerton High School every year which recognizes students for academic excellence from each high school in the Rock Valley Conference. Career and College Fair

CJSH students participated in our annual College & Career Fair! A special thank you to the 45+ college & career partners who attended for educating and supporting our CJSH students! In the weeks leading up to the fair, students had the opportunity to meet with Mrs. Paynter, Work-Based Learning Coordinator, to update their resumes and prepare professional questions. Peer Mentoring

Peer mentors serve as role models in the areas of academic achievement, social-emotional learning, and co-curricular involvement. This program is designed to aid incoming 7th graders in a smooth transition from elementary school to middle school and the remainder of the school year. The peer mentor program provides benefits to both the mentor and mentee. Peer mentors gain pride in knowing they are making a difference by helping others all while gaining valuable leadership experience. There are currently ten 11th graders, and four 12th graders who are in this leadership role. This is the 18th year that CCSD has endorsed the peer mentor program. Special thank you to Mrs. Read for all 18 years of hard work that she put into this program, and to Mr. Gamble for assisting in finding senior students that are mentoring some of our 8th graders.







DECA Nationals

Representing Clinton DECA in the School Based Enterprise Food Operations project were Makenzie Manthei and Mia Walker. Earlier this year Makenzie, Mia, Madison and Cheyenne Shull wrote a business plan for our beloved Cougar Cave that focused on promotional strategies and our school store expansion. 


Rock Summer Internship


Business Services Update

This fall the Clinton Community School District opened the 22-23 school year for our students with a maximum efficiency two building set up, all thanks to the successful November 2020 referendum.

This voter approved referendum allowed the District to make much needed renovations and improvements, that came in on time and under budget. The renovations included up to date mechanical infrastructures that are now helping with energy cost avoidance. Final work is being wrapped up this coming summer 2023.

Because the voter approval came in at a time of historically low interest rates (1.9%), the repayment payment period of the referendum was significantly shortened. CCSD is working hard to continue financial planning to further shorten the term of the referendum while long term planning to avoid tax levy swings.

- Thank you to the community for your support to provide the high quality educational environment for students at Clinton.
- Under spent budget funds from savings in the regular budget throughout the year are being placed in a maintenance fund for future repair needs.
- The tax rate stayed flat for the 22-23 school year.



ESSER Funding Update

In response to the Covid-19 pandemic, the US Congress passed several stimulus bills. Each of the bills included funds intended to assist school school districts in addressing issues relating to Covid-19. As of March 2023, CCSD has spent 49% of the total ESSER funds available. Committees have delegated the remaining amounts for responsible, non-cliff spending in the 23-24 school year. In other words, the spending will be used for one-time expenses in 23-24, rather than on going costs which would still exist after the funds expire on September 30, 2024.
