


Year In Review

Thank you community members for your support of the referendum in November of 2020 transitioning the district from three buildings to two. Below are some of the building improvements that have taken place in the district! For more information, please visit our website clinton.k12.wi.us

Future 4K-6 Clinton Elementary School

- 21,000 square foot addition, which includes 8 new classrooms and a cafeteria/commons area.
- All new mechanicals, including heating/air conditioning.
- New educational furniture and instructional technology.
- Installed new plumbing and electrical throughout building
- Transitioned to LED lighting.
- ADA renovated restrooms
- Both gyms received complete makeovers.
- New flooring, ceiling, and paint in all classrooms.
- New playground equipment to include a gaga ball pit, basketball court and four square areas on a new pour and play rubber surface.
- All new cubbies and lockers installed as well.



Clinton Junior Senior High School

- Added a new 18,000 square foot auxiliary gym.
- Added 5,000 square feet to our CTE wing which includes a fully functional Autos Shop, improved Ag Shop, updated greenhouse, and outfitted those areas with over \$300,000 worth of new equipment.
- New Air Handling units, 220 ton Chiller, and an energy efficient condensing boiler.
- Roofing for both buildings completed in phases, with a completion date of spring of 2024

New asphalt will be installed throughout the district this summer!




RVC Academic Honors

Redefining Ready

There are so many factors that go into producing the great students we have here at CCSD and we are tracking many of them--attendance, co-curricular involvement, community service, state testing, etc. With that data, we know that about 35-40% of our students typically go to 4-year colleges and the state provides a meaningful academic measure, the ACT, for those specific students. But how do we measure our success in meeting the needs of the other 60% of our students?

Redefining Ready is a set of research based indicators that provide information related to more than just state mandated standardized testing. This framework allows us to measure and report out on students being College and Career Ready.

When we send our students out into the world with their diplomas, they go down a variety of paths throughout their lives, not just one. Student-chosen paths, whether they be workforce, apprenticeships, college, technical training, military, etc., are all great options no matter if they start down them immediately, have a gap year, or change their mind five years later. We also know that life tends to throw curveballs and opportunities at us and we want our students to be prepared for whatever life has in store for them--not just the one thing they think they want to do when they are 18-years old.

Students learn in a variety of ways and should be able to demonstrate readiness differently as well. Having students be Career, College and Life Ready and utilizing the Redefining Ready framework to measure our success, identify our strengths and set specific goals related to identified areas of growth helps meet ALL of

our students' needs; not just 40%.

- 95% were enrolled in a dual-credit course
















For the first time in CCSD history, all 3 schools received the PBIS College Bound School of Distinction award!

Referendum Financing Update

The successful November 2020 facilities referendum for \$32 million dollars is allowing the District to make much needed renovations and improvements to what will soon be the Jr/Sr High School and Elementary School buildings. The additions and renovations are currently on time and under budget. Because the District was able to finance the project during a time of historically low interest rates, there will be over \$14 million saved in interest over the life of the borrowing period. Those low interest rates will also shorten what was projected to be a 26 year repayment period to 20 years - 6 years fewer debt payments! CCSD thanks the community for its support and is working hard to ensure that the funds provided are being used in the most effective ways possible to improve the educational environment for students both now and in the future.

ESSER Funding Update

In response to the Covid-19 pandemic, the US Congress has passed several stimulus bills. Each of the bills has included funds intended to assist school districts in addressing issues relating to Covid-19. Below is a summary of each of these bills:

ESSER I:

Stimulus Bill: CARES Act

Performance Period: 3/13/20 - 9/30/22

ESSER II:

Stimulus Bill: Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental

Appropriations Act (CRRSAA)


Performance Period: 3/13/20 - 9/30/23

ESSER III:

Stimulus Bill: American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA)

Performance Period: 3/13/20 - 9/30/24

As of May 2022, CCSD has spent 34% of the total ESSER funds available. The graph below shows what percentage of the amount spent has been used for each of the eligible categories. The District is working hard to allocate the remaining funding to best support students and staff at CCSD. Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the ESSER funds survey in February. Your input meant a lot and is helping to shape the ESSER budget.
